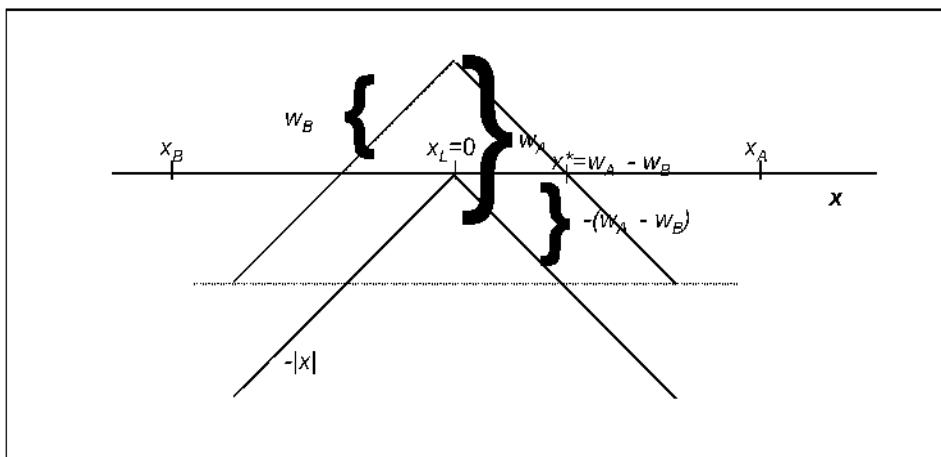


FIGURE 2. Equilibrium to the lobbying game.
